## **Officer Reports continued**

Greetings GFWC-WI Sisters,

Happy New Year to all of you. I am praying that in 2021 we will all get to see more of each other in person.

I know that Barb Pontow is already recruiting candidates for the 2022-2024 term, so I thought that I would share a bit about what being corresponding secretary means. I have the obvious job of recording and managing the correspondence of our state organization, but there is lots more. My second job is to assist the incoming president in the construction and assembly of her state directory and handbook. Abby and I worked together for weeks this summer on this project and then it was my job to distribute it to all of you at the Fall Workshop. I will again assist Abby this summer in doing some updates because of officer changes, address, phone, and email changes and get these updates to you. My third job is to keep track of voting credentials. I need to be sure that at BOD meetings there is a quorum, and I need to call the roll at BOD meetings. At state conventions, I need to be sure that each club has the required representative voting credentials as required by the bylaws. My fourth job is to take reserva-

tions for all meetings and conventions. This means I need to keep track of who is eating the chicken and who has the veggie wrap for every meal. I also need to be sure that every gal's dietary restrictions are noted and ordered. I also need to create tickets for each meal and special event. Then I need to assemble each person's packet for the meeting with the appropriate name tags, voting cards, credentials, meal tickets and tickets for special events. As a part of this job, I need to gather volunteers to help me woman the registration table where members pick up their materials for the meeting. This fourth job requires me have good skills with Excel and Word. Although for much of the year, my job is incredibly quiet, it gets rather exciting just before each meeting.

Within the next few weeks, you will be sending me your reservations for the Winter Workshop using the call included with this newsletter. Please note that registering online can be done later than sending the reservation in by mail. This is partly because of recent issues with the USPS but is it mostly because my mail will be forwarded during the month of January, and I do not want to miss a single reservation. With online reservations, I get the update within one day, not a week or more through the post office. It is easy to pay online through PayPal; please take advantage of the extended deadline for those registering online versus mailing in a check. It is a safe way to be sure your registration is recorded. By doing it online, it is easier for me to read; and I do not have to decipher handwriting, which can be problematic for email addresses and correct name spelling.

Our community service project for the Winter Workshop will be making "no sew" hats and scarves for children. There is a place on the registration form to register for this activity. We need to know how much fleece to have on hand to keep your hands busy after dinner on Friday night. To the right is the picture of the finished project. You need to be able to cut and tie knots and that is all; no special skill set required. If you have a good fabric scissors or shears and plan to participate, please bring them to the Winter Workshop.

Here are some patriotic ideas that we can do socially distancing ourselves:

• Consider purchasing or printing copies of the United States Constitution for distribution. One organization that provides copies at bulk rate is <u>https://</u> <u>freedomfactor.org/</u>

- Provide information on correctly folding a United States flag, plus the meaning and symbolism in the flag folding ceremony, to scouts, school groups, and others. The American Legion offers clear and concise instructions.
- Create a play, puppet show, or exhibit to teach young students about "Symbols of the United States," including the US flag, Uncle Sam, the Liberty Bell, the bald eagle, the Statue of Liberty, and others. Why not do the show on Facebook Live!

## **GFWC Leadership Education and Development Seminar (LEADS)**

The GFWC LEADS program is intended to identify GFWC members at the grassroots level who have the potential and the desire to assume leadership positions in GFWC beyond their club. Participation in GFWC LEADS can help these members gain the capabilities, confidence and commitment necessary to pursue and achieve higher office and serve with distinction. The LEADS program is held annually the day before (Friday) the official opening of the GFWC International Convention (Saturday-Monday). LEADS is a full day of activities, and includes breakfast and lunch. A graduation ceremony is held at the conclusion of the day-long program.

Some important details are as follows:

• One attendee each year from each State Federation is eligible to participate in LEADS. GFWC will cover a portion of the attendees' expenses, including:

- 1) Round-trip travel to and from the GFWC Convention city, up to \$250
- 2) Lodging allowance of one-half of room charge for two nights at official Convention hotel
- 3) Breakfast and lunch during the LEADS program
- 4) Checks will be distributed to candidates upon attendance and completion of the seminar.
- State Federations may consider underwriting a portion of attendee's expenses (i.e. additional lodging, meals, or Convention registration). GFWC-WI supports our candidate by underwriting up to \$1000 of eligible expenses.
- LEADS attendees are expected to be responsible for a portion of their expenses as an affirmation of their personal commitment.
- The LEADS participant is responsible for making her own travel and lodging arrangements.
- Note for GFWC-WI: In prior years a LEADS welcome reception occurs on Thursday evening and a LEADS breakfast occurs on Saturday morning. Watch for details regarding these events in the convention program and plan your travel accordingly.

- Explanation of GFWC resources, materials, and assistance
- Discussions on GFWC policies, procedures, and parliamentary law
- Tips and techniques for pursuing leadership opportunities

#### **CRITERIA FOR PARTICIPATING IN LEADS**

It is highly recommended that each state candidate for LEADS:

- Demonstrates leadership capabilities at the club level as an active club president, club officer, or club project or committee chairman.
- Exhibits a commitment to Federation.
- Exhibits an understanding of the GFWC mission of community service, illustrated by programs and projects in which she is or has been involved.
- Demonstrates leadership skills, including, but not limited to, organization, responsibility, trustworthiness, enthusiasm, and flexibility.
- Exhibits an interest in and willingness to pursue higher leadership positions in Federation.
- Understands and accepts potential expenses involved in participation.
- Has not held elected positions at or beyond the state level. This criterion is recommended in order to encourage potential leaders at the club level to apply.
- Has not attended a previous LEADS program. Members are eligible to attend only once.
- Agrees to share information gained from participation in LEADS with others in the state.
- Agrees to the following additional criteria established for GFWC-WI:
- Agrees to serve and actively participate on the GFWC-WI Leadership Committee and contribute to the GFWC-WI Mini LEADS Presentation Team.



December is such an exciting month for children and can be disappointing for needy or sick children. So the club decided to hold a Drive Thru Donation Drop-Off to benefit children. Three charities benefiting children were selected: **Hope Closet** (clients needing food or clothing services by referral from our local school district), **Operation Smile** (for children undergoing cleft palette surgery) and **Heifer International** (which supplies farm animals for families).

This event was held outdoors at a local church parking lot on Friday, December 11 from 11 am to noon. The 22 member participants were masked and distanced and those driving through remained in their cars. Seven masked volunteer club members removed donated items without contact.

• **Toys/Gifts for Hope Closet client children** - In December each family served by Hope Closet is able to pick out a larger toy/gift item and a smaller item for each child in the family (toddlers to teens) and gift wrapping. Because the number of families receiving assistance increased this year, the need was much greater than previous years. Especially appreciated were gifts for older children

(sports balls, games, nail accessories, lotions). Club members generously stepped up to meet the need by donating 150 toys/gifts (value \$3,000) and \$76 for those children. Later in the month pickup of gifts by families was arranged outdoors in the church parking lot with individuals masked and socially distanced.

- Operation Smile Patterns and directions for sewing gowns for children undergoing surgery were available at the drive thru. All patterns were distributed to members willing to sew. A donation of 3 yards of fabric (value \$21) for the gowns was made and 1 completed gown has been received. More will be completed over the next few months.
- **Heifer International** Heifer provides animals for families to alleviate hunger of children around the world. In fall a GFWC Woman's Club of West Allis website was created by Heifer International so members could donate online, phone in or mail in. To
